Canadians all along the route of the convoy turned out to show their support.

I thought it was important for you to see this cultural aspect of Canada.

I ran into this one video by an ordinary guy in British Columbia who got very excited about the protest and was creating videos about it.

And I found another video showing scenes from the convoy with a patriotic song.

The main target of the protest is the Prime Minister, Justin Trudeau.

In theory, the Queen of England still rules Canada.

For all you new subscribers who were asking me about where I live, this is where I live.

I'm on an island, I'm on the Southern Gulf Islands in BC, and [when] I did a video a couple hours ago it was pouring rain.

Well, it stopped, and now the sun is peeking out as you can see down there.

So this is my, this is my view.

During the summer it's pretty much clear and hot all the time but this time of year quite often I wake up and I'm above the clouds, like this was yesterday morning.

And I will turn the camera around.

I got a little, a little off-grid guest cabin right there, hot tub and there's the cabin that is currently still under a bit of construction.

A little mini tiny cabin.

And of course the media is doing exactly what we knew they would do.

They're going to go into crowds of hundreds of thousands of people and try to find the one or two, you know, troublemakers or people sending the wrong message.

Which is obviously going to happen, obviously, but we knew the media would pick it apart.

Especially, especially, our our state-run CBC and then the other networks like Global and CTV which are heavily funded by the federal government. (CBC = Canadian Broadcasting Corporation)

Uh, so of course they're going to do anything they can to try to discredit hundreds of thousands or millions of Canadians, peace-loving Canadians, who want their freedom.

They'll do anything to try to, try and smear that.

And it's all about sensationalism, selling fear and selling a narrative.

And sure enough, they've already done it.

There's a couple of people in the protest that, uh, there are a couple of people, that were like drunk and stuff.

Oh, what do you expect? It's a damn party in the nation's capital.

You know, there's so many people there or a couple of people were spotted with, uh, let's just say questionable offensive flags.

Honestly that's what you would expect at any big gathering like this.

So up in Canada the convoy of truckers converging on Ottawa to keep the nation free is going larger by the day.

They left from Vancouver on the western side of the country on Sunday.

They're protesting the federal government's vaccine mandates for cross-border truckers among other things.

That mandate took effect on January 15th preparatory to a worldwide digital travel pass, internal passports for everybody, linked to your health status but not limited to your health status.

If you can't see the future in clear outline right now you're not paying attention.

But the truckers in Canada can.

The Canadian trucking alliance estimates that roughly 16,000 truckers in Canada are not vaccinated.

That convoy also includes truckers who are vaccinated but who aren't going to stand for tyranny.

So what's the reaction been like from our media gatekeepers?

Well, a cartoonist for the Washington Post accused the truck drivers of fascism.

There's the cartoon on your screen, so a paid vassal for the world's richest man, a man who supports censorship, and crushing anyone who doesn't agree with him, who treats his own legions of workers like serfs.

A guy who works for that man is telling you that people who peacefully assemble to express political opinions are called fascists.

Really, who's the fascist, pal?

Hey, Martin why are you here.

For freedom, for all my friends, my family.

I sacrifice very much money for here, but it's amazing.

That's an historic moment, you know what I mean? Thank you.

Man, this is exciting guys.

Canadians have finally come together.

This is a true Canadian when you see them love their brothers and sisters.

The way all this love is floating around here, it's so awesome.

What does it say, sorry?

So it says f your white nationalist agenda.

I am not a white, this is nothing to do about whites, this is nothing to do with truckers, this is about freedom for all of Canadians.

This is about freedom and Trudeau has no right to put us in this condition of mandates.

Throughout the country children are not going to school. It's a terrible thing to do.

Hey, it's Andrew Lawton, with True North.

We are on Parliament Hill in downtown Ottawa in front of center block, for the truckers for freedom convoy.

It hasn't even started yet and this place is packed.

We've got trucks lining Wellington Street.

We'll show those in just a moment.

We've got people from all over the country here and the message is a very simple one.

It's not about violence, it's not about white supremacy it's not about extremism.

Well, I mean, if you watch the CBC or listen to Justin Trudeau it is.

No, it's about freedom, it's a very simple message, it's a very unifying message and it's one that the people here are making sure is known.

I'm just going to get you to look at, just the lineup of trucks.

Now this is before the convoy has even officially rolled into Ottawa and it's going all down Wellington Street.

People were honking all night long last night, got a little bit of sleep and then it started again early this morning.

And what's happening here is people from all over the country are saying they're done with vaccine mandates, they're done with a lot of the unscientific covid responses and they want the federal government to know that they're here and they're going to be heard.
